Attached is a copy of the park project survey the Community Services Board (CSB) requested to be undertaken as part of the Recreation Plan update public input process. The form, developed by Planning Intern Neil Henne, is based on the recreation project priority question included in the 2006 Citizen Survey, as directed by the CSB. The CSB wanted some updated feedback on the question from the community. It is recognized that this is not a controlled, City-wide, random survey as was the 2006 survey. Anyone may respond any number of times, although we have asked people to identify themselves.

A survey form display ad will be published in the *Evening News* beginning Sunday, August 2. We will also be putting out a PSA to the local radio stations explaining where to get and submit the survey forms. As noted, the form will need to be available on the City's website for downloading. If possible, we are hoping to have a direct link right on the City's homepage. Parks and Rec Intern Eric Buttil will assist with taking survey responses submitted by phone. Finally, FYI, Rotary Park is not listed because funding has already been secured through MNRTF to undertake all the Rotary Park master plan phases as one project, and an "Other" item has been included so people can write in a project if they wish.
