The program will be followed by an optional tour of the church. All programs are free to the public, and refreshments will be served.

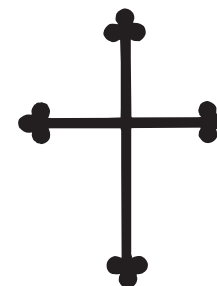
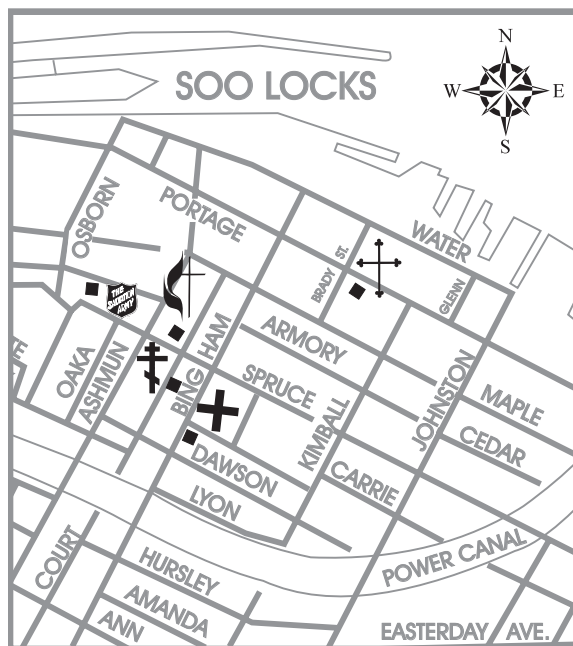
